Dear Friends,

As 2011 continues to unfold, so do plans for our forward movement in the mission of Christ at St. Andrew.

Among them are plans for the organizational development, program, and staffing of Wellspring. Two upcoming meetings will seek to determine which doors God is opening for us with respect to this much needed ministry to equip and encourage church leaders from throughout our region and beyond in their leadership and in their personal and spiritual wellness. Please keep Wellspring in your prayers in the coming weeks. And if you still aren't familiar with Wellspring, log on to St. Andrew's website (www.mystandrew.org) and click on The Wellspring Center for more information.

Meanwhile, plans are also moving forward this year toward the completion of the lower level of our church facility. Let me assure you that doing so is vital to the growth of St. Andrew's witness for Christ. Under the leadership of Paul Lobien and Larry Zimmerman, our Building Committee has had several meetings with our architect and has arrived at a proposed floor plan that already has the blessing of several ministry team leaders and will soon be shared with interested members of St. Andrew at an upcoming Town Meeting. Our plan includes space for our Creative Arts/Craft Ministry, Wellspring, storage, and for the expansion of our KidCentral, Confirmation, and High School Youth ministries, all of which have tremendous potential for continued growth along with our growth in the membership and participation of our congregation. In addition, opportunities for expanded use of the Great Room and current Youth Lounge on the upper level will be greatly facilitated through the relocation of our Craft and Youth ministries to a brand new home. There is no doubt in my mind that the time is right to go forward!

That means the time is also right to once again seek the resources necessary to take yet another step forward in a journey that God is so richly blessing. The good news is that we are keeping the covenant we made at the outset of the Continue the Journey campaign. By God's grace and through your Spirit-guided support, the Great Room has been completed. The parking lot was paved. Congregational debt was reduced. Ongoing ministries were supported (i.e., we stayed afloat through our first two years in our new church home). Last, but not least, we supported the Ablaze for God's Mission funding effort of our denomination. After all that, we anticipate that more than \$400,000 will be available to launch the lower level project. While very significant, that amount



will likely represent about one fourth of the presently estimated project cost. With that in mind, our Funding Team, led by Bruce Winter, will be seeking to carry out the task set before it by our Board of Directors in presenting us with a new

opportunity to complete what we have started for the glory of God. It is the team's hope that this coming spring will be the season in which we launch that new campaign. Again, I ask you to keep this important step forward in your prayers and to rejoice with me that God continues to add to our number those who are finding a spiritual home at St. Andrew.

As I consider these and other challenges in the days ahead, I am reminded of Martin Luther's reminder that in this life we are always "on the way." That remains the spirit of our congregation, for which I give thanks and glory to God as we go forward, once again, in the mission and ministry of Christ.

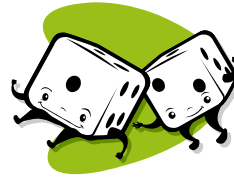

KidCentral News



Our KidCentral lessons continue to track through the church year in February. February's lessons all focus on the Sermon on the Mount:

On February 6 we hear about God making His people "salt" and "light" with good works

that glorify Him and pointing others to the saving light of Christ. In Christ, we are each a light that points to Jesus as the way to the Father.

On February 13 we continue to hear about the Sermon on the Mount and focus on anger. As God has reconciled us to Himself through Christ, we seek to be reconciled to one another in the forgiveness of Christ. Even though our forgiveness frequently falters, God's forgiveness in Christ remains constant, transforming us to work for reconciliation with our neighbors.

On February 20 we learn more about forgiving, hearing that through Christ, we can forgive and serve even our enemies, as Ananias did. Our sinful flesh causes us to fear for our lives and fight against our enemies. The perfect love of Jesus drives out fear and moves us to reach out to those who persecute us.

On February 27 we finish our study on the Sermon on the Mount and learn not to be anxious or to worry. As we seek God's kingdom through Christ, we are freed from worry, knowing we have all we need. We worry about our life because we depend on ourselves instead of God. Jesus describes the Father's love for creation to show us His love and take away our worries.

The Bible verses for this month are:

February 6, 13 and 20 – John 3:16: For God so loved the world that He gave His only son that whoever believes in Him (Jesus) should not perish but have eternal life.

February 27 – 1 Peter 5:7: He cares for you.

Please review the verses with your children to help them memorize and understand them. Children in the 3rd grade and above also learn the books of the Bible, so be sure to ask them to repeat them back to you every Sunday. Ask your children to tell you about their weekly lessons and go over the materials they bring home to help them remember these wonderful words of truth.

MANNA Food Collection – February 13

Watch for sales and plan to help fill the MANNA truck with non-perishable food on Sunday, February 13. Manna Food Center is the main food bank in our



county, which nearly every county nonprofit organization relies on to provide essential food to their clients.

Founded in 1983, Manna Food Center strives to end hunger in Montgomery

County through education, advocacy and food distribution. Since its inception, Manna has distributed more than 33 million pounds of food to more than 2.1 million individuals. Through the regular distribution program, Manna feeds about 3,300 families each month at 14 locations and provides each family with a three-to-five day supply of perishable and shelf-stable food.

Hunger is a hidden, but prevalent, problem in Montgomery County. One of every four county residents is at risk of hunger and over 29% of all students qualify for a free or reduced price meal, an indication of the poverty faced daily in our community.

Help the Hungry on February 22

Many restaurants in Montgomery County will support the hunger relief work of local nonprofit agencies by contributing a percentage of their sales on Tuesday, February 22. **“Thanksgiving in February,”** is a program that raises funds to support county agencies providing food and grocery money to those in need. If you have children or grandchildren younger than age 19 who are not covered by health insurance, the Children's Health Insurance program may help. To find out more, visit

www.insurekidsnow.com or call toll-free 1-877-543-7669. The number connects you to your state's program.

If you are a Medicare recipient with limited resources and income, you may be able to get extra help paying your monthly premiums, deductibles, and co-payments under the prescription drug program. If you have not yet completed an Application for Extra Help (form SSA-1020) you can still do so. Even if you already filed and were not eligible, you may want to apply again. Some things no longer count as resources and income. You can apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov/extrahelp. You may also call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 and apply over the phone.

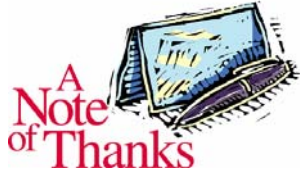
