Dear Friends,

Every year before Confirmation Sunday, I interview each of the young women and men who are preparing to publicly affirm their baptism and pledge their lives to God. Like those of adults who join our congregation, the promises, if taken seriously, are hefty. And so, I talk with them not only about what they've learned but also about their commitment to being descendants of a movement for which their spiritual ancestors laid down their lives. After all, when the big day comes, the questions will fly, and by the time you read this, they will already have been asked and answered.

"Do you reject the devil and all his empty promises? Do you believe in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? Do you intend to make diligent use of the Means of Grace? (Translation: Will you show up after today and actually attend worship services and receive the Lord's Supper frequently?) Will you support the work God has given to our congregation with your time, your talent, and your treasure (i.e., your money, like the money you spend on iTunes or a pair of hot new Nikes or games for your X-Box)? Here's the biggie: Do you intend to continue steadfast in the confession of the church and suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?"

"Yes, yes, yes, yes."

The truth, of course, is that some won't even suffer a weekly worship of God in the presence of His congregation, much less suffer death for the sake of Christ, in part because that's the example the adults in their lives have set for them. Others will invest their money on everything but the kingdom of God and will become a sad illustration of our Lord's words that "wherever your treasure is, that's where your heart will also be." We see it all the time.

On the other hand, I was excited to hear two of this year's young confirmands tell me they might want to be pastors when they grow up! And I honestly don't think they said it just to pass the interview. Another one talked about being a missionary. Still another said that he loses track of the time when he prays! And then there's the joy of seeing two individuals I confirmed years ago here at St. Andrew now serving as confirmation teachers in our congregation today! Another just got back from the Peace Corps!

Meanwhile, we're ramping up for another great Vacation Bible School experience this month as we also get ready to send 45 members of our youth ministry to our denomination's national youth gathering under the leadership of another former St. Andrew confirmand. Amazing.

When Jesus gave us the parable of the sower (check out Luke, chapter 8), He told us it would be just like this. Some seed will fall on rocky ground, some on the path, and some among thorns. But some will land on good soil and will "yield a hundred fold." The point is clear. While the outcomes may vary, our job is to keep scattering the seeds and never stop.

As you watch the crops grow this summer while you're driving in the country or heading over to the beach, pray for our new confirmands and for the other new members who will unite with our church family this month as signs that God's word really is taking root in the good soil of our community of faith. Join me in giving thanks for those who scatter those seeds through their teaching, mentoring, parenting, and faithful examples. Think about how you're doing at scattering the seeds of God's Good News to the world around you and about the extent to which your own life represents good soil in which that same truth is growing deep. Affirm your promises to the One who gave you everything and renew your commitment to worship and service as a descendent of a movement for which your spiritual ancestors laid down their lives. Say yes to Christ and live that way for His glory, your joy, and the hope of the world.

As you do, may God bless our church family as we enter another season of life, ministry, and growth in Christ.

Since EMEAN does not distribute food, clients are referred to the Manna truck that makes a weekly distribution in the area on Fridays.
