Dear Friends,

By all accounts, D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones was an extremely influential 20th century Welsh pastor, who for almost thirty years led the ministry of Westminster Chapel in London. But when he retired, he summarized what seemed to be a very fruitful and successful ministry by saying "I built a crowd, but I did not build a church." Wow.

While part of me thinks that the Reverend Lloyd-Jones may have been a little too hard on himself, it's also true that his words have haunted more than a few who have carried the baton of ministry in many other places around this world.

By the grace of God, St. Andrew is a growing congregation. Not long ago, we experienced an "almost Easter Sunday attendance" except that this year it happened on Palm Sunday with hundreds more joining us on Easter. At about the same time, one of our High School Youth Class teachers warned me that we are beginning to outgrow our new Youth Lounge, which happens to be the largest classroom we have right now. And you've already read my nagging about parking issues on Sunday mornings. But with these blessings (and blessings they are!) comes the call to build a church and not simply a crowd through an even greater commitment to deepened spiritual growth through our community of faith.

As the leaders and staff of St. Andrew look to the future, I'm happy to report a few of their more recent responses to that great spiritual challenge. One is the formation of what we're calling a Connections Team, which is already implementing ways of facilitating truly meaningful relationships in Christian service, friendship, and spiritual growth in greater measure at St. Andrew. In addition to Connections, three other new groups have recently started in the areas of wellness, fellowship, service, and Christian education. A Spiritual Life Team will soon be brought together for the purpose of encouraging the whole flock to bring the resources of our faith into focus throughout our church life. Last but not least a new Funding Team will encourage us in some of the financial aspects of our relationship with God. I know that some people don't believe that our use of money is a spiritual issue. Trust me. It is.



In the meantime, I continue to rejoice in the stories I hear all the time about the acts of spiritual support, generosity, and compassion that are quietly carried out by the people of St. Andrew. I receive unsolicited comments from our guests about the sense of genuine community they feel when they join us in worship. With amazement I also recognize that in addition to supporting our ongoing

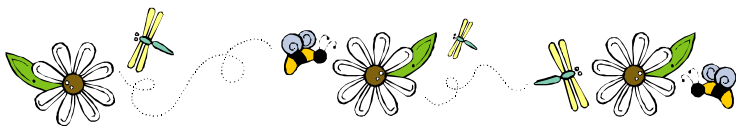
ministry, you have brought tens of thousands of dollars in compassionate giving for the sake of people far beyond our flock in the first quarter of this year alone.

While no church on this side of the river is perfect, and St. Andrew is far from it, I thank you for the ways in which you aren't just building a crowd. You really are building a church. More accurately, God is building His church through you. That's what you've always been about ever since we first met back in 1996 and, I know, long before.

While the challenges before us remain enormous to me, I know that the God of Easter and Pentecost will continue to provide all that we need to fulfill His calling to know Him a little bit better and make Him known a little bit more every day, so that together we might keep on building a church that by His grace will include an ever growing crowd.

Continue the Journey Update

As we enter the final year of the giving phase of the Continue the Journey capital campaign, our campaign leaders report that \$1,100,648 has been given to date



(a little more than 65% of the total pledged) with \$620,258 remaining against pledged amounts within the one year remaining. Our leaders feel that these numbers tell us that “overall we are pretty much on

schedule which is good news considering the economy.” Thirteen givers have contributed less than 20% of their pledged amounts to date. Forty-three have contributed less than 50%. On a positive note 52 have contributed more than their pledged amount totaling \$42,237. We give thanks for pledges made, gifts given, and commitments yet to be fulfilled for the sake of God’s mission at St. Andrew.

Haiti Update – Using the generous contributions of our congregation, the proceeds of the Hope for Haiti Concert and some Thrivent matching funds, the St. Andrew's faith community was able to make a crucial difference in the lives of 16 family members in Haiti. The family of our member, Derson Jolteus, lost its home, business, two family members and everything they owned in the devastating earthquake in Haiti. They are now living outside Port Au Prince in a house rather than on the streets of the city. Our congregation provided funds to rent the house, food for the family, and transportation to the home. Shortly after moving to the new location Derson's mother died. We were able to assist with funeral costs and fund another trip for Derson to attend the funeral in Haiti. We have also provided help with Derson's living expenses here. The Global Mission Ministry Team is exploring ways to use the remaining funds to assist others in Haiti who were impacted by this tragedy.

Several members of our team helped with the **Career Fair** both in recruiting resource people to participate and at the fair as greeters and runners.



Our Social Action Team meets on the third Monday of the month; the next meeting is May 17. We'd joyfully welcome new members and would
